We have already organised two fabulous teachers to cover their maternity leaves and will give the parents/carers of Nursery and Y1 children more information nearer the time.




Reception have been using their senses! They have been for a sound walk, smelt and tasted different fruits, taken part in a feely bag game and looked at pictures to find the hidden characters.
